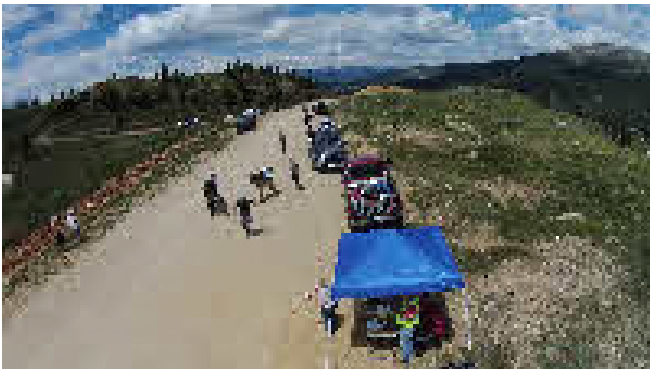


HAM RADIO OPERATORS

Be a part of Colorado's Summer Heritage Sport!

Enthusiasts have been racing with their burros for 65 years and Ham Radio Operators have been providing support for more than 30 years. The Park County Radio Club coordinates Ham volunteers from Colorado (and other states) to provide support for the two longest races each year. On the last Sunday in July, racers start off in Fairplay and race to the top of Mosquito Pass and return, a 29 mile course over rough terrain and elevation gain of 3,000 feet. On Sunday of the first full weekend (Fri to Sun) in August they do it again starting in Leadville for a 22 mile course following 4-wheel drive roads again to the top of Mosquito Pass and back down returning through the notorious mining area of California Gulch. Both locations also have a shorter race that some participants do.
